

AUS: Mobility: knowledge and innovation thrive on global exchange

Support for international mobility, both outbound and inbound, is an important instrument of the Swiss Confederation's education and research policy. Each year, the Federal Commission for Scholarships for Foreign Students awards **Excellence scholarship** to talented doctoral and post-doctoral researchers from over 180 nations, including all countries in Oceania.

Thanks to **bilateral trainee exchange agreements** concluded by Switzerland with a number of partner countries, including Australia and New Zealand, young professionals can expand their professional and linguistic skills abroad for up to 18 months. The mobility of young Swiss professionals and graduates also contributes to the international recognition of Swiss educational qualifications and standards abroad.

In recent years, the Embassy of Switzerland in Australia has expanded the offer of instruments and pathways available to young researchers and professionals eager to experience international mobility between Switzerland and Australia. From 2019, the ThinkSwiss Research Scholarship programme allows undergraduate students from Australia to pursue short-term research projects at a Swiss university. The Mertz Fellowship programme, launched in September 2022, targets early-career researchers from the polar and high-altitude science communities in Switzerland and Australia.

The Embassy in Canberra is competent for the three scholarship programmes (Excellence, ThinkSwiss and Mertz Fellowship) and the main point of contact for Australian nationals interested in the Young Professionals programme in Switzerland. For New Zealand nationals interested in the Excellence scholarships or Young Professionals programmes please contact the Swiss Embassy in Wellington.

Since the beginning of 2022, Switzerland has been included in the **Australian Work and Holiday programme**. Young Swiss aged 18 to 30 have now access to 12-month visas to experience life in Australia while working, studying and traveling. This opportunity is an important milestone for the

bilateral relations between Switzerland and Australia and for people-topeople links. The Swiss representations in Australia are not involved in this process; applications have to be lodged with the Australian Department of Home Affairs online.

As of 1 January 2022, Australian citizens do no longer need a long-term National D visa for studying, working or for family reunions in Switzerland. However, they need an authorisation, an assurance of residence permit, by the competent Swiss authorities. All related queries must be addressed directly to the competent cantonal immigration and labour market authorities before entering Switzerland. The Swiss representations in Australia are not involved in this process.

Dear Readers of the Swiss Review Dear Swiss in Australia

It seems only a short time ago I informed you about my appointment as the new Consul General of Switzerland in Sydney. It is hard to believe that this was five years ago how quickly the time has passed.



My term in office as Consul General will end on 31 October, 2022. My successor is Ms Cornelia Camenzind who will arrive from Chengdu / China where she was previously posted as the Consul General of Switzerland.

The last five years will be remembered by my husband Nigel and myself for many reasons; wonderful moments spent with the Swiss community in different states and cities, great experiences and personal contacts made all over Australia on different trips but then there were also floods, bushfires, the pandemic, lockdowns and closed borders.

It was an interesting, exciting and challenging posting in many ways!

It was an honour and a pleasure to be in charge of the Consulate General with its nearly 26,000 registered Swiss citizens – the 7th largest Swiss Abroad Community in the world. I certainly enjoyed the many friendly encounters with members of the community, the meetings with the different Swiss Clubs, the representatives of the OSA and I would like to thank every one of you for your ongoing interest and your support of members of our community.

Luckily for us, the Australian experience does not end here. I will retire from my work with the Swiss Department of Foreign Affairs and, like you, will make our permanent new home here in Australia. Nigel and I are very much looking forward to this new challenge and the new chapter in our lives.

The Consulate General in Sydney will not only get a new Consul General, there are some other changes that I would like to mention here. Our Consul and Head of Chancery, Sandra Valentini Roberts, has left for her new posting in Ottawa and her successor is Andrea Köppel Nko'o who arrived from Tokyo. Further, the Deputy Consul General, Didier Boschung, will leave at the end of the year and will be replaced by Jérôme Charbonnet, arriving from Ho Chi Minh City.

I am sure the new team at the Consulate General will continue to be here for you all, for your questions and any queries you have.

Detailed information about the fees, which documents we require from you and how to make an appointment will be sent out upon receipt of your online application. The closing date for the online passport registration will be 25 October 2022.

Introduction of the new Swiss passport (new Design)

The Federal Office of Police (Fedpol) announced that a new design of the Swiss passport will be introduced from 31 October 2022. More information about the new series of passport can be found on the website of Fedpol: https://bit.ly/3Bw1yK6

The functionality of the new passport and the issuing procedure will remain the same. Documents issued before this date remain valid until their expiry date.

The Swiss passport will continue to appear in the familiar red cover. Together with the 26 cantons, the 'fifth Switzerland', which which stands for the Swiss Abroad, will now also be represented on one of the visa pages.

If you would like a passport in the new design, you can book an appointment from 1 November 2022 to register your biometric data at our office in Wellington or on occasion of the mobile passport station in Auckland (4 & 5 November 2022) and Christchurch (10 & 11 November 2022).

If you have an appointment at the Embassy in Wellington for the collection of biometric data before 1 November 2022, the passport will be produced in the old design.

We look forward seeing you soon in Wellington, Auckland or Christchurch.

SWISS+OZ Art Expo 2022 NSW: White Rhino Artspace, Sydney

On Thursday 4 August we celebrated the opening of the Swiss+Oz Art Expo 2022 at White Rhino Artspace in St Leonards, Sydney. Art appreciators, many from the Swiss community, enjoyed a drink and some delicious Swiss cheese to mark the occasion while viewing the eclectic exhibition held in this light-filled gallery space.

Sensitively curated by Regula Wettstein, the exhibition that ran until 20 August 2022, showcased a stunning collection of works by Swiss/Australian

artists in a variety of media: printmaking, paintings, drawing, photography, sculpture, Lichtfenster and mixed media installation.

The theme of this year's exhibition was HOME – a place we got to know, explore or miss so much more during the last few years of COVID-impacted life. The term 'home' has taken on a whole new meaning for many including artists. Working from home, not being able to travel, investigating new-found creativity and art practices at home. Learning to fully appreciate nature and the beauty of our own backyard. Longing to travel and reconnect.

This year's artworks explore these themes. The sculptural chair in Ulric Steiner's work and the window in Dorothee Heibel's painting for example, have certainly taken on a new importance and symbolic meaning for many when having to



isolate or quarantine. Edmond Thommen's works remind us of cocooning yourself at home, Beat Birchmeier explores our beautiful Australian countryside, **Jessika** Steiner's abstract paintings explore her 'homes' of Switzerland and Australia through the common theme of water, an allegory for movement across continents. Rita Winiger's abstract landscapes depict scenes from her Australian home in the northern tablelands of NSW, Helen Halliday's

paintings draw inspiration from the flora and fauna of her new home on the north coast and Michele Heibel's finely detailed etchings pay homage to the Australian bush using humour and joy to draw the viewer in to each tiny narrative. Dong-Shin's Calendar installation is a very personal work reflecting her thoughts and her journey throughout the tricky year of 2020. Between them, each artist has interpreted the theme of **HOME** in a personal manner that connects beautifully with the audience.

Thank you to Consul General Bernadette Hunkeler Brown and Ambassador of Switzerland, Caroline Bichet-Anthamatten for visiting the exhibition. It is so heart-warming to see our Swiss community coming from far and wide to support each other.


